The Columbia Basin Fish & Wildlife Authority's Fish Screening Oversight Committee will be sponsoring the Pacific Northwest Fish Screen and Passage Workshop hosted this year by the Idaho Department of Fish & Game in Salmon, Idaho on September 9-11, 2008.

The biannual workshop will focus on fish screen and passage work conducted throughout the Pacific Northwest. Appropriate topics will include new fish screen designs, advancements in fish screening technology, fish screen repair and maintenance concerns, fish passage issues and solutions, and project evaluations. The goal of the workshop is to share information on both viable as well as problematic designs.
