The 2009 Pacific Northwest Fish Screening and Passage Workshop will be held September 15-17 in Newport, Oregon. The workshop is a bi-annual event organized by the Fish Screening Oversight Committee (FSOC). The workshop provides a forum for technical discussion and information exchange regarding design criteria and guidelines, biological study results, testing and assessment of experimental technology, and improvements in manufacturing and construction techniques.

This workshop since its inception in 1992 has had a tremendous beneficial affect in improving the design, construction and maintenance of fish screening and passage facilities. The funding and success of this workshop depends heavily on the attendance and participation of the engineers, biologists, managers and especially the technicians directly involved in fish screening and passage in the Northwest.
